- Published the DOC4Kids report, a national report on how housing affected child health, the first of its kind
- 2001 became first medical director of Medical-Legal Partnership-Boston, and served as the Medical Director of the National Center for Medical-Legal Partnership from 2007-2016



Households in Crisis

results

- A rise in COVID-19 cases is likely to cause <u>another round of closures and</u> <u>shutdowns</u> and expand the unemployment rate
- The CARES Act's federal eviction protection ends on July 25
- Over <u>6.7 million cost-burdened</u> households face evictions
- Congress must prioritize financial relief and housing requests supporting lowincome renters








U.S. Poverty Requests



Will you personally speak to Senate/House Leadership urging them to prioritize the following in emergency response legislation:

- \$100 billion in emergency rental assistance and a national eviction moratorium in the next emergency response legislation
- Boost the maximum SNAP benefits by 15 percent
- Expand the EITC and CTC for low-income workers and families

If there is time: Will you speak out publicly in support of a refundable renters' tax credit to help families access affordable housing longer-term?

Plan Follow-Up Meetings



1. Plan follow-up meetings with members of Congress

- MoCs are on recess July 6-17 a vital time to connect with Congress members
- Request virtual face-to-face meeting with senators
- Follow-up with Senate and House housing aides
- Focus on convincing Senate GOP members to support targeted financial relief for low-income renters
- Remind Senate Democrats to prioritize our housing asks

Back-Up Housing Requests with Published Media



- 2. Generate media on the importance of rental assistance in the next COVID-19 emergency package
 - Publishing now can help back up our asks
 - Write a letter to the editor urging Congress to pass emergency housing assistance
 - Use recent stories in your local paper as hooks for letters to the editor and op-eds






Note: Shaded grey bars indicate recessions Source: Congressional Budget Office



Economic Downturns Not Felt Equally








Food Insecurity in Last 7 Days

- 4. Complete your lobby report
- 5. Put people in action on current requests

Follow-up with the appropriate aide(s)


- Do ASAP & get a response. This is as important as the meeting.
- It further develops the relationship and holds them accountable

What to include:

- Thank you for meeting
- Reiterate your request
- Supplemental information (leave behinds on IC resource page)
- If you don't hear back in a couple of days, contact the aide again



House: Frankel-Rooney Letter



Dear Speaker Pelosi and Minority Leader McCarthy:

We write to request robust funding for the international response to COVID-19 be included in the next phase of emergency funding. As we were harshly reminded when this pandemic rapidly spread from Wuhan to Washington, infectious disease threats know no borders; as long as the COVID-19 pandemic is spreading anywhere in the world, Americans everywhere are at risk.

Emergency COVID-19 Legislation



House

- Passed HEROES Act (May) with no global funding
- Regular FY 21 State-Foreign Operations bill includes \$10 billion in emergency aid

Senate

- Yet to act
- Expected to introduce and debate legislation the week of July 20

Our Requests



- \$20 billion in international aid, including:
- \$4 billion for the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB, and Malaria
- \$4 billion for Gavi, The Vaccine Alliance
- \$2 billion for Anti-Hunger, including at least
 \$500 million for Nutrition
