1. Fund the fight against poverty (U.S. and global)

Intro text

In 2025, we are:

Pushing Congress to make a \$2 billion matching commitment to the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB and Malaria.

Asking for increased funds for global nutrition, TB programs, education, child health, and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance.

Building champions in Congress for each of these issues making sure Congress stays united against any attempts to cut funding.

Item	Time Frame	Accompanying Text
Appropriations Advocacy	February - May	Every year in the federal spending (appropriations) process, Congress decides where the government's money goes. By funding health, nutrition, and education programs around the world, a relatively small amount of money makes a transformational impact. With the administration threatening to cut funds for global poverty programs, we need Congress to come together in a

bipartisan way to protect – and increase – this funding. We
can tell Congress what they should prioritize – convincing
them to join public letters and submit their own funding
requests, and raising our voices in the media.

Our goal by the end of 2025 is:

The U.S. recommits to the Global Fund's lifesaving work with full funding

Record high funding across all our priorities – and record high bipartisan congressional backing for that funding

2. Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB and Malaria

Intro text

In 2025, we are:

Calling for a bold new pledge from the U.S. to the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB and Malaria, the world's most powerful tool for supporting community-led health programs.

Building on two decades of bipartisan leadership from Congress on the Global Fund and supporting new congressional champions.

Securing Funding	February to May	We'll work with members of Congress across the political spectrum in the annual appropriations process to support \$2 billion from the U.S. for the next fiscal year, as part of a 3-year matching pledge.
Mobilizing Members of Congress	January to September	The Global Fund partnership has saved 65 million lives, but the work against AIDS, TB, and malaria is far from finished. We'll pull out all the stops to get Congress to continue to support the Global Fund in a bipartisan way, and to show the world we aren't backing down. We'll organize in our community, write to the media, and work directly with members of Congress to rally behind the Global Fund.
Pledging Summit	October	The Global Fund will invite the world's governments to come together to fund the fight against these three diseases over the next three years (exact date TBD). We want the U.S. to show up strong, as they have the last twenty years.
Investment Case	February	The Global Fund will launch its plan for what it can do as a partnership over the next three years – and what investment they need from donors like the United States government to make it possible.

Our goals by the end of 2025 are:

A three-year matching pledge from the U.S. to the Global Fund, putting in \$1 for every \$2 from other donors.

A swell of on-the-record bipartisan support in Congress for the Global Fund.

3. Nutrition (U.S.)

Intro text

In 2025, we are:

With ongoing threats to cut public benefits, we will rally our communities and tell Congress to protect and expand essential food programs like Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Special Supplemental Nutrition for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).

[SNAP]: Opposing cuts to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), the first line of defense against hunger in America, on any Farm Bill or annual government budget Congress will pass.

[WIC] Urging lawmakers to fully fund the Special Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).

SNAP + WIC	January – March	In the first 100 days of Congress, we need to educate lawmakers on our own set of policy priorities to help set the broader congressional agenda for the rest of the year. This includes protecting and opposing any spending cuts to nutrition programs like the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Special Supplemental Nutrition for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).
SNAP	March - September	Congress still needs to pass a Farm Bill, which includes the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) that provides food benefits to low-income households. In years past, SNAP faced threats of spending cuts, and Congress unfortunately imposed temporary additional work requirements for older able-bodied adults without dependents in 2023. We cannot let Congress reduce funding for SNAP and make it harder for Americans facing hunger to get it. Food, like housing and other

		necessities, is critical as people move up the economic ladder.
WIC	March - September	Congress has fully funded Special Supplemental Nutrition for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) for over two decades. But like SNAP, WIC faces threats of spending cuts in the current Congress, as lawmakers continue working on the federal government's annual budget. Because of inflation and greater demand for the program, additional funding is needed so eligible lowincome pregnant and post-partum women, infants, and children up to age 5 who are at nutritional risk can access nutritious food.

Our goal by the end of 2025 is to:

Protect, preserve, and expand funding for programs that promote the health of and access to nutritious food for low-income households and people living in poverty.

[SNAP]: Prevent spending cuts to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

[WIC]: Secure full funding for the Special Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).

4. Tax code for economic justice

Intro text

In 2025, we are:

Advocating for a fairer tax code that will support low-income families and households. We will make our voices heard early and often to influence lawmakers.

Asking lawmakers to include a federal renter tax credit as part of the solution to the affordable housing and homelessness crisis in any tax reform bill.

Publishing media on the CTC and RTC (e.g., op-eds).

Item	Time Frame	Accompanying Text
First 100 Days	Jan – March	In the first 100 days of Congress, we need to educate lawmakers on our own set of policy priorities to help set the broader congressional agenda for the rest of the year. This includes expanding the Child Tax Credit for low-income households along with prioritizing renters through a federal renter tax credit to provide housing affordability in any tax reform.
Reconciliation Bill	Jan- March	The incoming Congress will move quickly to pass a tax bill in 2025, so we need to move just as quickly to influence our elected representatives. We will demand that the Child Tax Credit be protected, expanded, and made accessible to more families with low incomes. We will also push lawmakers to support a federal renter tax credit that will make housing more affordable for millions of low-income households
Tax Day	April	Tax Day is a great time to publish media about your tax priorities. Let your community and elected leaders know you expect a tax code that supports low-income families, renters, and other households while raising revenue from fair sources to fund vital human needs programs like housing, SNAP, Medicaid, and WIC.

End of year goals

Our goals by the end of 2025 are to:

Expand the Child Tax Credit so that more families with low incomes are supported.

Expand the Earned Income Tax Credit to all working adults and increase the benefit for those who do not claim dependents on their taxes.

Increase Congressional support for a federal renter tax credit.

5. Mobilizing new advocates for impact

Intro Text

In 2025, we are:

Recruiting advocates across the country to take regular advocacy action. We know a lot of people will be seeking ways to make a difference with the new Congress and Administration. We'll be ready to support them to amplify RESULTS' advocacy impact.

Providing monthly advocacy skills training and coaching to new advocates to support them to take regular actions that will bolster First 100 Days lobby meetings.

Supporting new volunteers in key states and Congressional districts to lobby members of Congress on important committees as part of the First 100 Days lobby campaign.

First 100 Days Lobby Support	January- April	New advocates in states without a strong RESULTS group will receive special training and support from RESULTS staff to meet with each of their Senators and key members of the House who hold critical committee membership. This includes AR, HI, LA, ME, MS, MT, ND,

		NE, NH, NV, RI, SD. If you live in one of these states, we'd love to support you!
Monthly Action Meetings	February- May	As people across the country seek ways to make a difference with the new Congress and Administration, RESULTS will be ready to mobilize them into action. We'll offer monthly skills training and action coaching meetings. Through these, advocates will take actions that amplify the impact local groups are making through lobbying. They will be ready to join their local chapter, equipped with powerful skills and experience, in May.
Media Project	February- May	New RESULTS advocates with lived poverty experience can opt-in to this special program. They will receive training and support to develop their personal story and adapt it to media advocacy. By May, each advocate will have submitted letters to the editor that will bolster the impact of RESULTS First 100 Days lobbying and highlight their personal experience in their local media.
Spring Recruitment	January- April	We know many people will be looking for ways to make a difference. Through our Spring Recruitment Campaign, we'll be sure that RESULTS opportunities are visible, and our doors are wide open, ready to welcome new advocates to our movement. New advocates will be supported to take action in our Monthly Action Meetings through May.
Fall Recruitment	August- December	We'll take advantage of this key recruitment moment and invite new volunteers to get involved and commit to taking action with RESULTS. We will have a special focus on recruiting volunteers to take on specific volunteer roles that will strengthen their local chapter.

Our goals by the end of 2025 are to:

Strengthen our grassroots network by introducing committed new volunteers who are trained in powerful advocacy skills.

Support numerous new advocates to strengthen their foundation of congressional advocacy, media writing, and community organizing skills and identify promising new leaders for the RESULTS network.
