Discussion Guide: Reflection on the Grassroots Anti-Oppression Audit

Purpose

The purpose of this guide is to provide a structure for conversations about the results of the grassroots anti-oppression audit. We want to ensure that all RESULTS advocates are aware of the findings and create a space where we can learn from the findings as individuals and as groups. We will be better at ending poverty as we have a better understanding of how poverty is rooted in oppression.

Tips for the facilitator and participants

- Ask participants to read the <u>audit summary</u> beforehand.
- **Listen openly, without judgment.** Anti-oppression work is often deeply personal, and everyone is in a different place in their learning. It is critical to listen openly so that all volunteers feel respected and heard.
- Ask open ended questions.
- If nobody knows the answers to questions that are brought up, that's ok. The facilitator can record them and field them with staff on the Grassroots Impact Team or full staff.

Guiding questions:

- 1. Who has read the audit summary? Do we need to take a couple of minutes to review?
- 2. What are some of your initial reactions to the anti-oppression audit results?
- 3. What does "anti-oppression" mean for you? How does it apply to you and your work as a volunteer with RESULTS? Or how would you describe the connection between the issues we advocate on and our work on anti-oppression?
- 4. What do you want to learn more about anti-oppression in 2022?
 - 1. Introductory training on implicit bias, microaggressions and understanding of systemic racism and oppression.
 - 2. Building Capacity for Difficult Conversations
 - 3. Trauma-Informed Care
 - 4. Bystander Training
