GAIA Vaccine Foundation's mission is to reduce the incidence of infectious diseases that disproportionately affect the underserved and promote the development of globally relevant, globally accessible vaccines that can be distributed on a not-for-profit basis in the developing world.

Summary

Our grant will fund a year-long educational community outreach campaign on HPV, the HPV vaccine and cervical cancer. This campaign will assist in the introduction of the HPV vaccine to Mali and improve general knowledge about HPV/cervical cancer so that women and girls are able to make informed decisions that are in the best interests of their health and wellbeing.

Why We Love This

GAIA Vaccine works in conjunction with social influencers, religious leaders, renowned musicians, nurses, and doctors involved in women's health care. It engages, educates, and destigmatizes information on HIV/AIDS by using storytelling cloths illustrating information about HIV transmission. These cloths are a unique and effective health education tool for a mostly illiterate society.

Gavi Resolutions – H.Res. 1286/ S. Res. 684



- Senate Lead Sponsors: Sens. Wicker (R-MI) and Cardin (D-MD)
House Lead Sponsors: Representatives Kean (R-NJ), Amo (D-RI), Salazar (R-FL), and Jacobs (D-CA).
- Calls for United States to have supporting role in saving children's lives of children and protecting people's health through Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance.
- Gavi has been a major contributor in reducing the number of childhood deaths in lower-income countries due to vaccine-preventable disease by 70 percent since 2000.
- Country ownership and sustainability are at the core of the Gavi model.

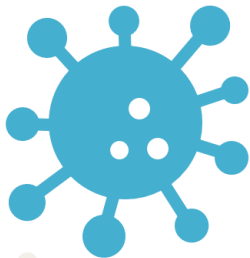

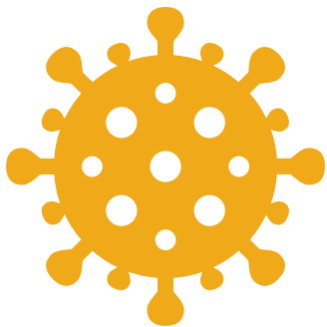

Vaccines are crucial for children because they are **particularly vulnerable** to infectious illnesses.





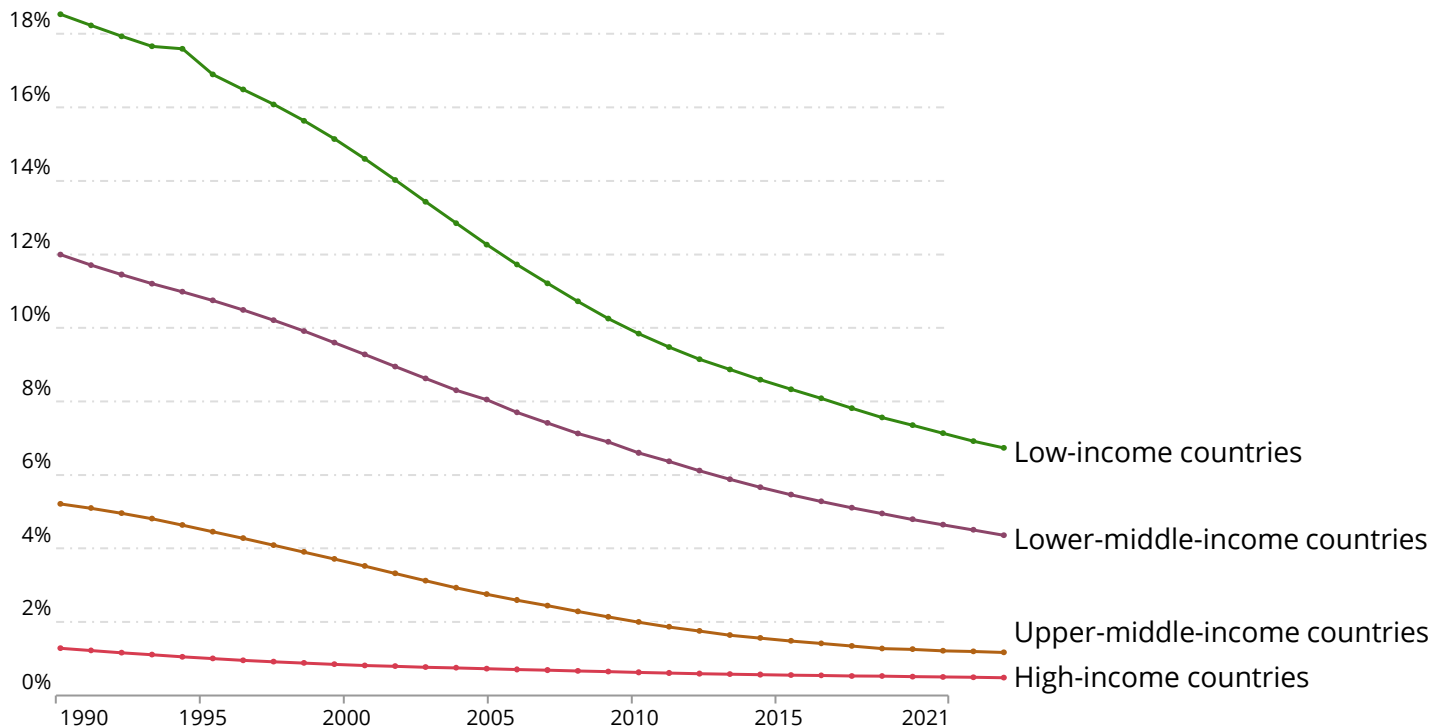

The estimated share of newborns who die before reaching the age of five.



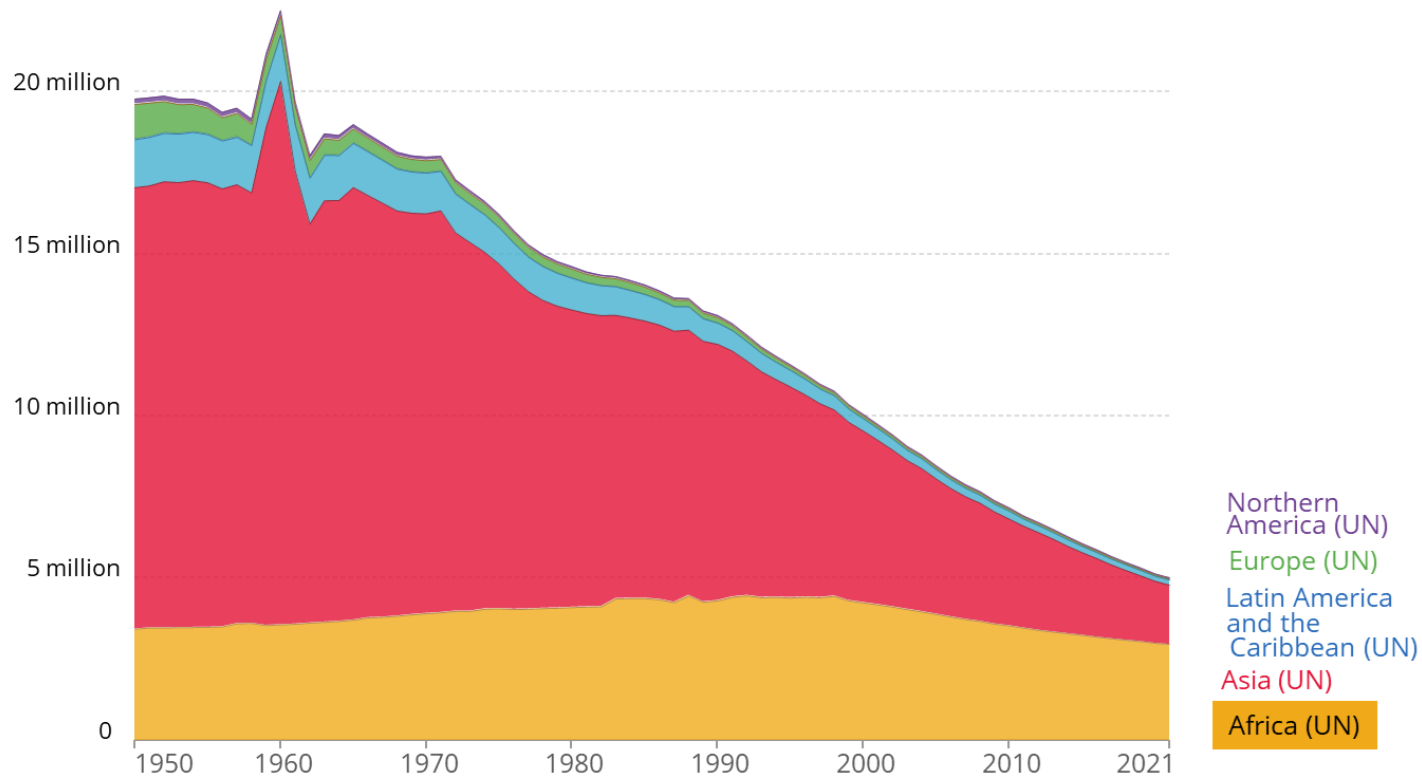

The estimated annual number of children who died before they were five years old.

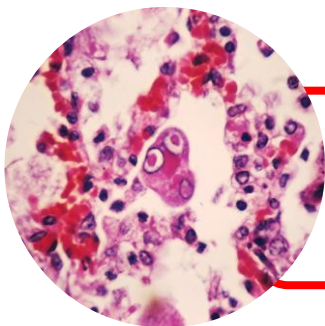

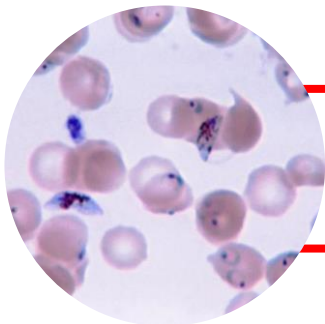

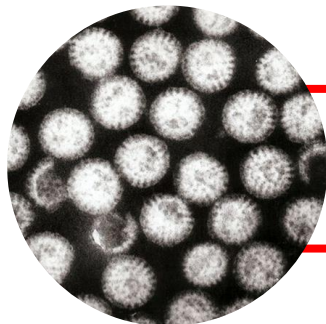

Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance is a public-private partnership that helps vaccinate more than half the world's children against some of the world's deadliest diseases.

children vaccinated through routine programmes, 2000-2022 - more than 68 billion in 2022 alone

The vaccine goal
56%
Breath of protection with vaccines in the Gavi portfolio is now higher in Gavi-supported countries (56%) than in the rest of the world (33%).

- 80+ Gavi-supported vaccine introductions and prevention campaigns took place in 2022 - in addition to 40 national response vaccination campaigns supported by Gavi.
- 4 key DTP3 vaccines saw an increase in coverage among the 77 Gavi-supported countries since 2021.
- 20 countries accessed cholera, Ebola, meningococcal and yellow fever vaccines through Gavi-supported emergency supplies a total of 39 times in 2022.

The equity goal

In 2022, DTP3 coverage in Gavi-supported countries rebounded to 81% after two years of decline (compared to the 84% global average).

- 66m more children received basic routine immunisations through Gavi-supported health systems in 2022 than in 2021.
- 47 countries have installed more than 45,000 ICE units procured by UNICEF Supply Division through Gavi's CE2IP - nearly 13,000 in 2022 alone.
- 47 Gavi-supported countries increased MCH coverage from 2021 to 2022, but women literacy gaps remain a significant concern.

The sustainability goal
\$1.5bn by end 2022

In the face of fiscal challenges, climate change, conflict and instability, most Gavi-supported countries maintained or increased domestic resources for co-financing of Gavi-supported vaccines in 2022, bringing to USD 1.4 billion their total contribution since the introduction of the co-financing policy in 2008.

- USD 66 million was contributed by countries towards the co-financing of Gavi-supported vaccines in 2022 - the highest amount yet and a testament to country ownership and the long-term financial sustainability of Gavi-supported vaccines.
- 39 vaccine programmes originally set up with Gavi funding are now self-financed by countries as of 2022, up from 40 in 2021.
- 100% of countries fully met their 2022 co-financing obligations - except those unable for humanitarian reasons.
