U.S. Policy

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

results

- April: House passed their Farm bill (H.R.7567) which does not address the SNAP cost sharing policy
- June: Senate released their Farm bill, which does not address the SNAP cost sharing policy
- 60 Senate votes are needed to pass Senate bill, and Agriculture committee Dems oppose current version
- House and Senate will need to negotiate a final bill together



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Child Tax Credit (CTC)

results

- Stronger Start for Working Families Act (SSWFA)
- Bipartisan Senate bill (S.3596) led by Sens. Hassan (D-NH) and Young (R-IN)
 - Cosponsors: Marshall (R-KS), Cortez Masto (D-NV), Murkowski (R-AK), Warner (D-VA)
- Looking for a Democratic lead for the bipartisan House companion bill
 - Targets: Ways & Means committee Dems



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Housing Choice Vouchers

results

- June: House T-HUD subcommittee approved their FY27 bill
 - HCV funding below President's Budget Request, will not cover all existing vouchers
- Senate T-HUD bill has not yet been released
- House and Senate will need to negotiate final FY27 T-HUD bill
 - Not expected to be passed until after November elections

U.S. Poverty Asks

- **SNAP:**

- Oppose any Farm-related bill that does not delay the SNAP cost-share policy
- Tell congressional leadership to prioritize delaying or repealing the cost-sharing policy

- **CTC:**

- Expand the CTC to more families with the lowest incomes, in any tax bill this year
- SENATE: cosponsor the Stronger Start for Working Families Act (S.3596)

- **Housing Choice Vouchers:**

- Urge Appropriations leadership to increase funding for HCV in FY27, in order to renew all current vouchers and add 250,000 new vouchers

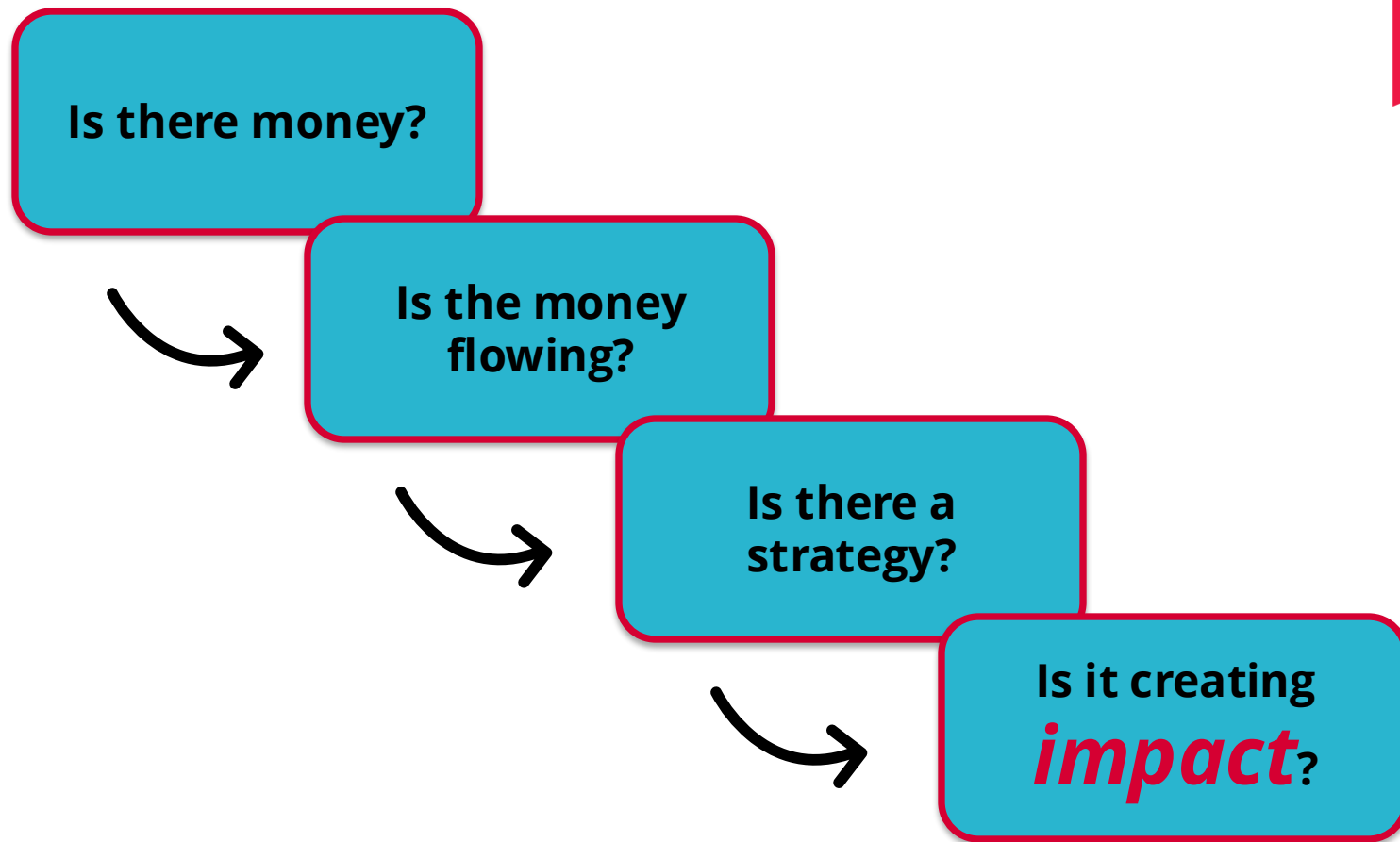

- **SNAP:**
 - Speak out publicly in support of SNAP and raise awareness of the impossible choice states will have to make
- **CTC:**
 - Targeted House members: Become an original cosponsor to the SSWFA
 - Speak out about the need for CTC expansion in local media and district events
- **Housing Choice Vouchers:**
 - Speak out publicly in support of access to housing and the importance of rental assistance and the HCV program

- May: House passed their FY27 NSRP bill
 - Overall cuts to global health and humanitarian assistance, but our issues were protected
- Senate FY27 SFOPS bill has not yet been released
- House and Senate will need to negotiate final FY27 NSRP/SFOPS bill
 - Not expected to be passed until after November elections

Mr. YOUNG (for himself and Mrs. SHAHEEN) introduced the following bill;
which was read twice and referred to the Committee on _____

A BILL

To prevent, treat, and cure tuberculosis globally.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “End Tuberculosis Now
5 Act of 2026”.

6 **SEC. 2. ASSISTANCE TO COMBAT TUBERCULOSIS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 104B of the Foreign As-
8 sistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2151b–3) is amended to
9 read as follows:

10 **“SEC. 104B. ASSISTANCE TO COMBAT TUBERCULOSIS.**

11 “(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

Legislation aims to increase *impact* and *accountability* of U.S. bilateral TB programs

- Bipartisan Senate bill led by Sens. Young (R-IN) and Shaheen (D-NH)
- Bipartisan House bill expected to be reintroduced soon by Reps. Bera (D-CA) and Salazar (R-FL)
- Last Congress: passed full Senate, passed House Foreign Affairs Committee

Global Poverty Asks

- **Tuberculosis:**

- SENATE: **cosponsor** the bipartisan End Tuberculosis Now Act of 2026 (S.4751)
- HOUSE: Be an **original cosponsor** of the bipartisan End Tuberculosis Now Act of 2026- reach out to Bera and/or Salazar staff
- Tell Appropriations leadership to protect and increase funding for bilateral TB in FY27

- **Foreign Aid:**

- Tell Appropriations leadership to reassert their constitutional authority over appropriated funds and protect critical foreign aid funding in FY27

Global Poverty Targeted Asks

results

- **Tuberculosis:**

- Champions: Speak to committee leadership about how TB is being prioritized in country level MOUs and urge them to continue to weigh in

- **Foreign Aid:**

- Targeted House Rs: Speak to RESULTS staff about leading or supporting a bipartisan resolution on the importance of global health programs
- Targeted Senate appropriators: Tell Appropriations leadership to protect and increase funding for humanitarian issues in FY27
- Targeted champions: Speak to Administration about CDC PEPFAR changes
