

As you determine priorities for the Fiscal Vear 2025 State, Foreign Operations and Ralted Agencies Appropriations Act, we respectfully respect that you provide global finding for the Maternal and Child Health (MCII) and Switzlino Accounts within the Global Health Programma. This Committee has a long-standing record of supporting critical, life-saving investments in global child and maternal health and nutrition. In 2020 alone, USAID helped more than 92 million women and children uccess essential—and often lifeaving—beath services, reaching 27 million children under five years old and 8 million pregnant women with high impact, life-saving matrition intercontions.

While reductions in global mortality rates for women and children are two of the biggast secess stories in international development, ther remain significant gaps that additional investments can help close. Before the COVID-19 pandemic, 52 million children under age fived dief from mainly preventable and treathed diseases each year, with malantiration as underlying cause of roughly half of these deaths. We are writing to request that you continue critical investments in global health programs, in particular the Prisadent's Timergancy Prisaden and Tail Steller (PFFFAR) and the Global Fund to Fight AIRS, roberculous and Malatais (Global Fund) in advance of its Seventh Replenishment in the Fall of 2022. In 2020, the Global Fund supported 21.9 million people on antiretroviral treatment for HIV, treated 4.7 million people for TB, and distributed 188 million insecticide-treated bed nets for malaria presentation.

Similar to HIV, progress on the TB epidemic hinges on finding the over three million people "missed" by beadin bystem each year. His focusing on 20 countries that account for a majority of missing people with TB globally, Global F and investments contributed to over one million additional TB case nontritations by the end of 2019.
