# Tell Congress: Fund the fight against global poverty

Every year Congress goes through an appropriations process to decide how to spend the money in the U.S. Federal Budget. Our mission as RESULTS advocates is to inspire them to take action to fight poverty. Currently Congress is deciding funding levels for specific accounts for Fiscal Year 2026 (FY26), which begins October 1, 2025. The Trump Administration has taken aggressive action to cancel foreign assistance contracts and shut down the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), so it is more important than ever that Congress include strong funding for foreign aid in the FY26 budget.

You can ask your Congress member to submit personal requests to the State and Foreign Operations (SFOPS) Subcommittee on Appropriations. They must urge the subcommittee to prioritize funding to critical global health and anti-poverty programs:

We can also ensure global health and education programs are fully funded by asking Congress members to sign "Dear Colleague" letters as a way for them to show public support with their peers. We want as many members as possible to sign on in support of our global anti-poverty priorities. Check the FY26 Dear Colleague Scorecard to see if your members have signed on to any letters yet this year. Then, reach out to their foreign policy staffers to ask them to sign onto the FY26 letters.

   Bipartisan letter led by Reps. Chrissy Houlahan (D-PA), Ami Bera (D-CA), Robin Kelly (D-NY), Maria Salazar (R-FL), and Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA). **Deadline: Friday, May 9**

  Letter: robust funding for Maternal and Child Health and Nutrition, and restoring
  full funding for Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance. Bipartisan letter led by Reps. Brian
  Fitzpatrick (R-PA), Sara Jacobs (D-CA), Maria Salazar (R-FL), and James McGovern (D-MA). Deadline: Friday, May 9
- FY26 House Tuberculosis (TB) Dear Colleague Letter: meet the needs-based ask of \$1 billion for bilateral TB programs. Bipartisan letter led by Reps. Ami Bera (D-CA) and Ann Wagner (R-MO). Deadline: Tuesday, May 13

## Subject: Please take action on FY26 global poverty appropriations

**Engage**: The U.S. has historically been an important leader in the fight against poverty by investing in effective and accountable global development programs that improve access to quality basic education, good health, and brighter futures.

**State problem**: However, global health and education programs have been devastated by the freeze to funding and termination of programs at the congressionally mandated USAID. Conflict and other crises also continue to reverberate. Deaths due to tuberculosis, AIDS, malaria, preventable childhood malnutrition, and cuts to education, all contribute to the theft of people's futures.

**Inform**: The State and Foreign Operations (SFOPS) Subcommittee on Appropriations will soon be considering spending levels for global health and education for fiscal year 2026 (FY26).

**Call to action**: Will you include critical FY26 funding levels in your personal requests to appropriations subcommittee leadership, Representatives Diaz-Balart and Frankel? (for letter to Senator replace with Senators Graham and Schatz) A memo is enclosed with information detailing a request for \$1.15 billion for Global Maternal and Child Health in FY26.

• Include a printout of the <u>Maternal and Child Health Memo</u> or whichever requests you are making
