Government Shut Down October 1, 2025 – November 12, 2025

Last night's House Vote



- Government reopened after a 43-day shut down (the longest in U.S. history)
- Funds most of the federal government through January 30,2026
 - Agriculture
 - Military Construction & Veterans Affairs (Mil-Con)
 - ☐ Legislative branch
- Hundreds of thousands of furloughed and/or work without pay will receive back pay and return to work.

- Foreign affairs budget is still in flux:
 - House FY26 Appropriations bill H.R. 4779 (July 2025)
 - Senate FY26 Appropriations bill still pending
- The window to influence final appropriations is still open while Senate markup negotiations proceed.


Fund: Standing up for the U.S. 1:2 match, and making sure the U.S. does its part to help save 23 million lives.





Championing the Global Fund





Global Fund impact:



In 2024 alone...

- 7.4 million people treated for TB
- 25.6 million people on HIV/AIDS treatment



What can a sufficiently funded Global Fund do?

- Support countries to save 23 million lives in the next 3 years
- The partnership can avert 400 million infections in this period
- Build sustainable health systems capable of reaching those most in need

EPIC Laser Talks: A Tool for Speaking and Writing



A laser talk: A very succinct, crisp 4-part piece about what you care about, why you care about it, and the action you wish a lawmaker to take in response

EPIC: A way to focus and organize what you want to say in your laser talk

Laser Talks: A Tool for Speaking and Writing



EngageProblemInformCall to action

E = **E**ngage



How can you capture the attention of your reader or listener?

- Perhaps a startling statistic?
- Perhaps a personal story about how a policy has personally affected you or why you are passionate about it?

P = Problem



How can you articulate the problem you would like the legislator to help solve?

- Can you describe how poverty is being created or exacerbated? Is it lack of access to nutrition?
- How would you explain the issue in a sentence or two to someone as if they are hearing it for the first time?

I = Inform



How can I inform my reader/listener on the solution for which I'm advocating?

- Are you asking for the policymaker to speak up to colleagues about a policy change? Maybe you are eager for the passage of a certain bill? Be clear about what you want.
- Describe this solution as a positive, proactive step.

C = Call to Action



What am I asking the member of Congress to do?

- Can you describe the action you're wishing the legislator to take in the form of a yes or no question? (i.e., "Will you co-sponsor . . ." or "Will you speak to . . ."
- Remember that your outreach to a congressional office isn't complete until you get a clear "yes" or "no" answer.

Inform

Call to action



Engage:

At the height of the AIDS crisis, the world came together to create the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria. Over the past two decades, this partnership has helped save 65 million lives and has always received bipartisan support in Congress.



Problem:

Despite recent **progress in global health**, millions of people are still suffering and left behind by their health systems. For example, tuberculosis (TB) — the world's leading infectious disease killer — sickened almost 11 million and killed 1.25 million people in 2023 alone.



Inform:

This fall, world leaders will make new pledges to the Global Fund. The U.S. has played a key leadership role for decades. **Our pledges bring other donors to the table** by committing to **matching \$1 for every \$2** from other countries.



Call to Action:

We need bipartisan leadership in Congress to deliver vital funding for the Global Fund. This also encourages other donors to come forward. Can we count on you to commit to continuing the U.S. 1:2 match, and will you also reach out to appropriators to ensure that this is included in the FY26 spending bill?


