
What is a lobby meeting?

A meeting with our elected officials or their staff, to influence them to take action around an issue.








Send the meeting request

Type of Meeting	How to Schedule
Face to face with member of Congress	 Send an email to the scheduler in DC office Call the DC office and ask to speak to the scheduler It does not hurt to do both!
Meeting with DC office staff	 Email the staffer directly Email the scheduler with your request and issues you'd like to discuss
Meeting with in-district staff	 Email the local office with your request and issues you'd like to discuss Call the local office and schedule directly with an aide

Send the meeting request

- 1. Identify the staff using Legislator Look-up
- 2. Derive email using formula
- 3. Send request with topic of meeting and suggested dates





Powerful speaking



"EPIC" Laser Talk Model

- E Engage
- P Problem
- I Inform
- C Call to action

E - Engage

Capture your listener's attention with a dramatic fact, short statement, or personal story.

In the case of a lobby meeting, we would be talking to the staffer or even the member of Congress.

P - Problem

Present causes of the problem you introduced in the first section.

How widespread or serious is the problem? How has the problem impacted you or your community?

l - Inform

Inform the listener about a solution to the problem you presented.

You might cite a recent study or tell a first-person account of how the solution has impacted you or others you know



C – Call to action

Call to Action answers the question "so what do you want me to do about it?"

Make the action something specific you can follow up on. Frame it as a yes or no question.

Example

Engage	<i>Personal Story</i> We know how to keep moms and babies healthy and thriving. Yet still: 300,000 women and girls die every year from lack of basic healthcare for pregnancy and birth. And 2.3 million newborns die in their first months of life.
Problem	The problem isn't a need for a new medical intervention that doesn't exist yet. It's ensuring that all people, no matter where they live, have access to lifesaving healthcare and basic nutrition. Things like routine healthcare for women and babies, access to emergency hospital care, training for health workers, access to lifesaving vaccines, and nutrition supplementation have all proven to save millions of lives every year.
Inform on Solution	USAID, the primary federal agency that administers foreign aid and development assistance, has a strong record of supporting maternal and child health programs that make a difference. In 2021 alone, USAID helped increase access to essential care for more than 59 million women and children.
Call to Action	We have the resources right now to ensure all children, no matter where they live, can access their rights to health and nutrition. We're asking you to help us make that possibility a reality. Will you support lifesaving maternal and child health programs by including \$1.15 billion for USAID Maternal and Child Health programs in your FY25 budget request?




